## WORKSHOP ON CREATIVE WRITING



A Workshop on Creative Writing by Smt. Supriti Garg M/o Yuven Garg of II-B for primary students was organised on 3rd November 2022. Our school also invited Smt. Rekha Rana M/o Anoushka Rana of class IX A and a senior IT consultant to present a fruitful session on Risks and Opportunities of Cyber Security in the changing era of IT, on 11th November 2022.

## VISIT TO CSIR



In the month of December, 2022 our school organised a tour to CSIR for medical students of class XII to attend the Open Day held at CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road. The visit was organized in collaboration with a parent under the Parent Partnership Programme. Ms. Purti, a Science Communicator, told the students about the different experiments and research work taking place in the IGIB Labs. Students were divided into two groups with volunteer PhD students who took them on a tour of different parts of the campus. Students were given an insight on the genome sequencing machine Novaseq 600 and Transmission Electron Microscope (TEM), the working and functioning of the microscope and how slides are made and loaded onto it. They were also given hands-on experience of gel electrophoresis.

## WORKSHOP ON DESIGNING WATERFALL CARDS

Smt. Monika Garg M/o Anika Garg of class Nursery A, a postgraduate in Bioinformatics and a self-taught artist conducted a Creative and Fun activity session on Making of Waterfall Card for students of class VIII on 4th February 2023. The hands-on workshop enabled the students to explore their skills and ideas to design waterfall cards using colourful sheets of



paper which could be used as greeting cards for sending messages to friends and family. It was also a great way to develop the students' fine motor skills, their power of observation and eye-hand coordination.

To raise awareness among the various user groups on the safe use of social media platforms, usage of digital payment and the internet across India, a

Cyber Awareness Campaign - 'Stay Safe Online' was conducted by Smt. Swati Sharma M/o Swananya Arya and Alankrit Arya of class II A and II B for students of classes VII and VIII on 07th February 2023, as part of Parent Partnership Program. She created awareness among students and youth about the safe usage of social media, e-commerce, online payment and other usages of the internet to save them from the cyber guard and online harm. She sensitized them about different ways to maintain the privacy and security of data. All in all, it was an interactive and informative session that focussed on how to stay cyber-safe.



## CYBER AWARENESS

### PARENT SURVEY ON IMPACT ON SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING



To understand the effect of COVID on our students, a survey was conducted on 8th April 2022 using a Google Form questionnaire which was forwarded to the parents. The form was duly filled by 1343 parents. The survey shows a very significant number of parents faced acute financial stress and most of them could manage their finances to sustain.

Parents were of the view that during COVID, family bonding between the members has improved, and use of internet, TV, mobiles, etc. jumped up quite a bit. Due to lock down, children became irritable, developed anxiety, and had adverse effect on their sleeping pattern. As classes were conducted in online mode, it had a negative effect on academics.

# *Breaking The Conventions*

## INITIATIVES

Innovation in our school is more than just a buzzword. It is fast becoming a way of learning and teaching for both our students and teachers respectively. Innovation in education encourages our students and teachers to research, explore, and use all the tools to uncover something new. One such strong strategy we have incorporated is sharing a new vocabulary word of English, Hindi, Sanskrit or French on a daily basis with students on an official platform to enhance their language skills.

To improve communication skills and self-confidence among students, following initiatives were taken:

1. Lingo Day which serves as a forum for students to express their thoughts and attain command in languages.
2. Spell Bee
3. Hindi Manch
4. Birthday Videos created and shared by students sets the tone for each one to be acknowledged and wished on their special days.
5. Daily prayer in the classroom is the norm of the school. Incorporating prayer in the classrooms, demonstrates to students the truth that God desires to be a part of every aspect of their lives whether that's in school, in sports, or one day, in their future careers.
6. A five Minute Oral Presentation in all English Classrooms before kick starting the actual class, the idea conceived by Sh. Bharat Salhotra, our Hon'ble Chairperson. This attempt has no doubt transformed our students into more dynamic and confident individuals and has improved their presentational skills.

Also, the Happiness programme, entrepreneurship cell and community service are some of the new paths breaking projects we have initiated and are now part of the curriculum.



## INTRODUCTION OF AI

To surface the importance of skills-based education as opposed to knowledge-intensive education, and the value of project-related work to “effectively harness the potential of AI in a sustainable manner” and to make India’s next generation to be ‘AI ready’, we initiated AI as a subject in class 9 three years ago with a capping of 15 students. This year we have offered Artificial Intelligence as a mandatory 6th subject from class IX. Several quizzes and apps have been developed by our senior ‘Computer Science’ students using programming languages like C++, Java, SQL, HTML and online utilities like MIT App Inventor, Kodular and many more

## WELL-PLANNED STUDY BROCHURE

A brochure for students to study abroad was prepared by our teachers to give an insight about varied study opportunities and prospects available outside India whether it is learning about the art forms in Carnegie or the chemistry of perfume in Paris or becoming a scientist of great repute in Oxford. This document will definitely open the gates of the outside world.



## REVAMPING OF EARLY CHILDHOOD AND SENIOR WING

The Early Childhood Section of the School has been revamped and reinvented, giving it a new look. The vision of Smt. Bindu Rana, our then chairperson, was translated into reality. On 23rd July 2022 it was inaugurated by Shri Shiv Dutt Salwan ji, Hon'ble Chairman Emeritus, Salwan Education Trust. Every wall around, now, is like a colourful canvas that speaks and has some wonderful stories to narrate that shall lead to a fun learning experience for the tiny tots.

The entire Senior Block at the Ground Floor has also been revamped. It was inaugurated by Sh. Sushil Dutt Salwan, Chairman Salwan Education Trust and Sh. Bharat Salhotra, chairperson. Well thought and well-designed 3-D models and live projects of core subjects have been created and placed aesthetically in the vacant spaces of the Ground Floor of the Senior wing to promote visible learning. The teaching faculty, senior students and most importantly our Art Department left no stone unturned to make the vision turn into a concrete reality. The entire zone has been transformed into a knowledge park which invites the students to think, visualise, analyse, explore, discover and expand their mental horizon. The installation of models like Pendulum wave, 3 D working of the heart, rotating chair, Modern Periodic table, Bioscope to take a glimpse of the monuments, Incredible India, Harappan Artefacts and many more has no doubt set the tone for new learning process.



## HUBS OF LEARNING

The Hubs of Learning is an initiative launched by CBSE for exchange of both physical and intellectual resources among neighbourhood schools. It's a collaborative partnership among the schools to ensure the enhancement of the quality of education and to promote self-improvement. This will allow not only exposure to best practices but also the possibility of adaptation or even replication of these practices.



Our school has been chosen as lead collaborator with 9 partner schools. Its first meeting was held at SPS MV on 17th December, 2022 wherein five schools took part along with Salwan Public School as the host school, to share their thoughts, activities and methods.

Under the 'Collaboration Programme' of Hubs of Learning, three virtual meetings were held in school on a monthly basis for the session 2022-23.

# School Committees

School Committees and their initiatives:

## TOBACCO CONTROL COMMITTEE

### A) POSTER MAKING COMPETITION OF "WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY"

Every year on 31st May 2022, the World Health Organization and global partners observe "World No Tobacco Day". To celebrate the day, we organized a poster-making competition on 12th May 2022 for classes 6th to 12th in the school premises in collaboration with Dharamshila Narayana Super Specialty Hospital. The annual campaign gave an opportunity to raise awareness on the harmful and deadly effects of tobacco use and to discourage the use of tobacco in any form in today's youth.

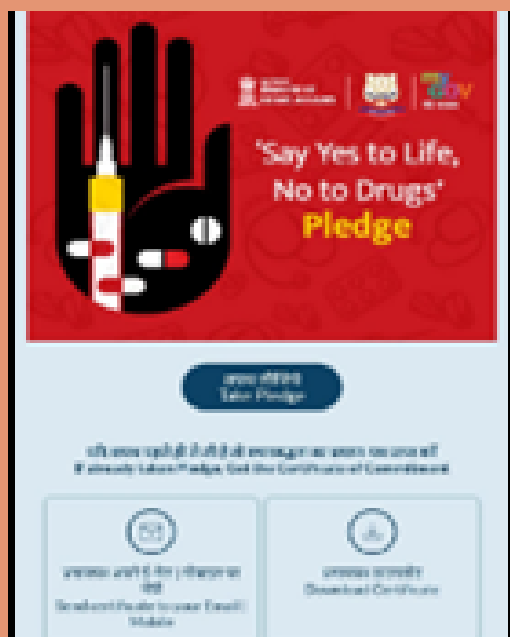


### B) NO TOBACCO ACTIVITY



The Government of India has adopted the vision of 'Drug Free India' with a resolve to fight against the menace of drugs. An online e-pledge campaign 'Say Yes to Life, No to Drugs', launched by Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) through My Gov Portal, was carried out by the school from 12th to 26th June 2022 with the participation of 66 staff members and 178 students. All the participants pledged - 'SAY NO TO TOBACCO' to spread awareness about its ill-effects.

### C) DRUG ADDICTION AWARENESS



Seminar on drug addiction awareness was conducted on 2nd August 2022 for students of class XII. The students attended this webinar. The main focus of the session was drug abuse awareness and education. The aim of this program was to help the young minds distress and make them aware about the ill effects of drugs. The resource person for the session was Dr. Preeti Jain who sensitized the students.

An online e-pledge campaign named 'Say Yes to Life, No to Drugs', launched by Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) through My Gov portal was carried out by our school from 12th to 26th June 2022. The e-pledge was taken by students of classes VI-XII, teachers and other staff members. All the participants pledged to SAY NO TO TOBACCO and spread the awareness about its ill effects to discourage its use among today's youth as it's rightly said, "The journey of a thousand miles starts with a single step" and saying no to drugs is the right step in this direction.

### D) SURPRISE CHECKING OF STUDENTS' BAGS

Surprise checking of students' bags was conducted by the members of the Tobacco Control Committee for the prohibited substances in the school on a regular basis. Students and staff were sensitized towards the same through regular counselling sessions.



## ANTI-BULLYING COMMITTEE

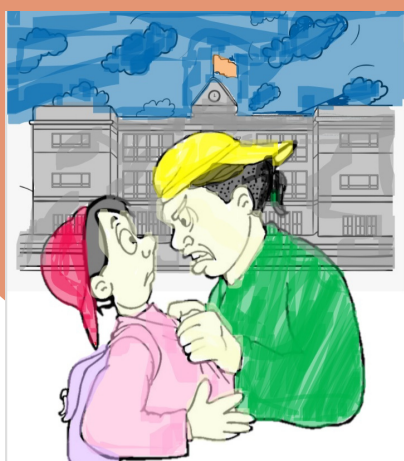
### A) OPEN HOUSE SESSION ON BULLYING AND IT EFFECTS

Bullying is defined as the action of repeated, aggressive behaviour intended to hurt another person, physically or mentally. Bullying occurs when a person is "exposed, repeatedly and over time, to negative actions on the part of one or more other persons. To bring awareness about Bullying, the school conducted an awareness activity for students. In this



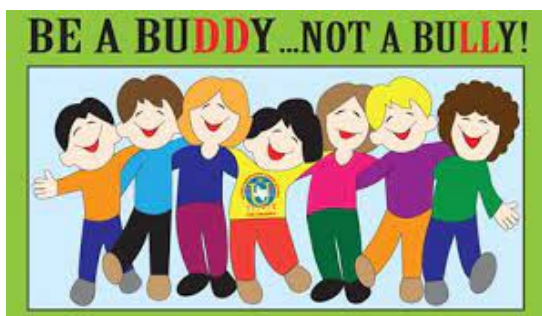
regard, we had open house sessions during the library periods for middle, Secondary and Sr. Secondary classes wherein students were made aware of human rights, democratic values, respect for diversity and the privacy of others physically or on social media. Students also actively participated in the discussions and were rightly advised by the Bullying Committee members to report Bullying to parents, teachers and the counsellor if they come across any such incident.

### B) POSTER MAKING ACTIVITY - ANTI BULLYING



To raise awareness amongst students, Anti-Bullying poster making activity for classes X, XI and XII was conducted in school. All the students actively participated in the activity and expressed their feelings through the medium of art.

### C) AWARENESS GUIDELINES ON BULLYING AND RAGGING IN SCHOOL BY CBSE



As part of Awareness Drive on Bullying, posters received from CBSE were displayed on the school notice boards in the Primary and Senior wing to create an amiable environment by way of messages and pictorial representation. The initiative was taken to have a positive school atmosphere where learning can take place peacefully.

### D) WEBINAR ON THE TOPIC "BULLYING AMONG SCHOOL STUDENTS"

Hindustan Times organized a webinar on 'Bullying among School Students- A Deep Dive' for the teachers and parents on 8th September 2022.



### 3) POC SO AND CHILD ABUSE MONITORING COMMITTEE



Regular meetings of the committee members were held during which activities were planned to sensitise the staff and students. The committee also provided the information regarding no cases in the school to DoE. The committee investigating cases/complaints for CSA/Harassment received a recommendation to adjust the camera's orientation to get a better view of the scenario, which was immediately put into action.

#### **4) SCHOOL SAFETY COMMITTEE**

##### **A) DISASTER MANAGEMENT (FIRE SAFETY)**

To educate and train the staff members for an unforeseen emergency like fire or any natural calamity, our school conducted a mock exercise and evacuation drill on 29th December 2022. Resource Person Mr. Firoz sensitized the staff about LPG safety rules and use of fire extinguishers. He shared real-life experiences and examples. A demo was given by Mr. Firoz on using a fire extinguisher at the end. Teachers learnt to use fire extinguishers and cleared their doubts. It was an informative and enriching experience for all the participants.



##### **B) MOCK DRILL FOR FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY**



As per the directions of Directorate of education, New Delhi, a mock drill for fire and life safety was conducted in order to inculcate awareness and preparedness during calamities. The mock drill was conducted on 19th December for classes VI-XII and on 29th December 2022 for classes Nur-V. The mock drill was carried out in the school to prepare students and teachers for any such eventuality under the fire risk reduction programme. The purpose to organize the mock drill was to check the readiness of the school to face any such fire emergency and also to make the students and staff aware about the Fire Fighting Rescue Operation. For every accessible location, we have an EXIT Plan and evacuation charts and duties and responsibilities are in place.

## 5) INCLUSION COMMITTEE

As a result of the inclusion committee's proposal, we have a dedicated walkway for kids who are visually impaired. There are braille names on the name plates for each classroom. Numerous additional such initiatives are already in the works and will soon be put into action.

### A) BUILDING STRUCTURE ACTIVITY



Blocks are a staple in every child's toy collection and it helps in motor and cognitive development. A Building Structure Activity was conducted for special needs students on 12th April 2022 to enhance their creativity, problem solving and social skills. Autistic children follow a strict routine and find it difficult to break from their repetitive behaviour. Building different structures our students ventured into new things and develop creativity. Students were asked to copy a structure first and were encouraged to build structures on their own.

### B) SHOW AND TELL

Counselling and Special Needs Department conducted Show and Tell Activity on 11th August 2022 to strengthen the verbal skills and to foster public speaking competency of the young minds. The special needs students from classes KG to class XII participated in this activity which helped them to build their self-confidence and self-esteem. It enabled them to improve their descriptive skills by communicating feelings, thoughts and emotions with words. It was an interesting and thrilling experience for the kids.



### C) MEMORY GAME ACTIVITY



For younger students and those with cognitive delays, it is essential to begin with providing concrete materials and opportunities for interaction with real materials in order to develop a conceptual understanding of their world.

“Make your own Tactile Memory Game Activity” was conducted on 22nd August 2022 for special needs students (Visually Impaired) wherein the student recognized and interpreted the information (2D object, solid embossed shapes, outlines of objects, raised lines, symbols/letters). They were asked to name and identify the items when presented and explain them with the help of a mind map.

### D) WORKSHOP ON INCLUSION



A workshop was conducted on 19th September 2022 to facilitate regular teachers and Special Educators to screen and tentatively categorize the 21 disability conditions at the school level.

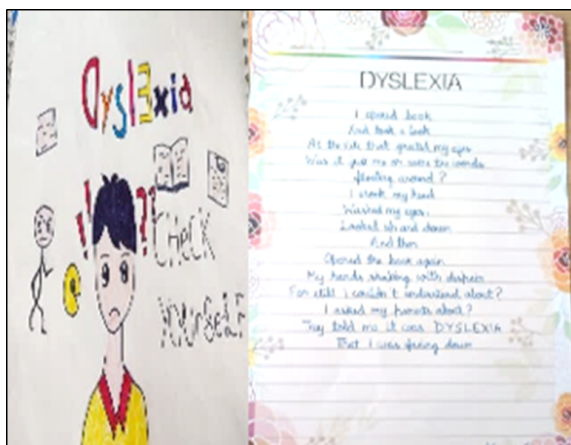
PRASHAST is designed to be used by the regular school teacher as they spend maximum time with students. Teachers are uniquely positioned to engage with the growth and development of children.

The form was discussed with all the staff members wherein they were guided that PRASHAST is only for screening and referral and no child should be labelled or diagnosed on the basis of this tool. The staff members were guided to complete part 1 and submit it to members of the Counselling and Special Needs Department.

## E) DYSLEXIA WEEK CELEBRATION



The Counselling and Special Needs department celebrated October as Dyslexia Awareness Month. This is an event to raise awareness and help others understand more about dyslexia. 680 students from grades IV to IX participated in various activities at school, such as poster making, poetry writing, reading, and quizzes. Students were also sensitized through oral discussions in class. These activities are a great way to raise awareness of dyslexic students' challenges in school. The students were sensitized and promised to be more supportive of the students having dyslexia.



## F) CELEBRATION OF WORLD LEPROSY DAY (2023)



World Leprosy Day (2023) was celebrated on 27th and 30th January 2023. Students from III-XI classes participated in the same. The aim of the event was to build an inclusive society and students were sensitized that if one is diagnosed with leprosy, should not be excluded from the society. The event raised awareness of the disease and it was a call for an end to Leprosy related stigma and discrimination. Activities like oath and display of posters were conducted in the assembly as well as in the classes.



## **6)GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL COMMITTEE**

An effective, fair and impartial redressal mechanism system is followed for addressing the grievances of parents, teachers, students and other stakeholders. Written / verbal complaints are redressed by the Principal / Committee. Complaints can be made via telephone, email. Written complaints can also be posted in suggestion boxes installed in the school premises. The school phone numbers & the email id are available on the Official Website of the school. No Grievance case has been reported in the session 2022-23.

## **7)DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE**

The Disciplinary Committee ensures compliance of Code of Discipline and Conduct for students and suggests suitable action in case of its violation. In case of matters concerning the campus, the Disciplinary Committee is empowered to take decisions. The committee ensures that students obey rules and remain orderly and peaceful in the pursuant of educational objectives/goals in the school community. After the issue was reported, the Disciplinary Committee made sure that students were abiding by the Code of Discipline and Conduct and recommended appropriate action in case of its violation.

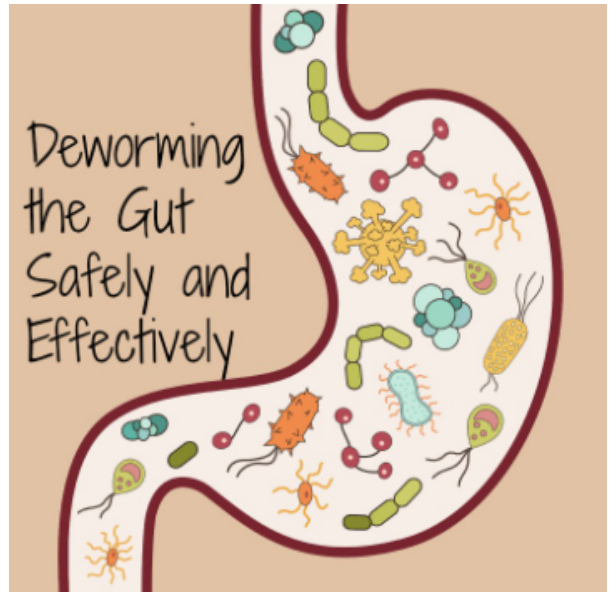
## **8) PREVENT SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT THE WORKPLACE AND ICC COMMITTEE**

The sexual harassment at work, place committee and internal complaint committee conducted a workshop for the female MTS and teaching staff, male MTS staff separately in order to inform them about the functioning of these committees, and to sensitize them against the sexual harassment at work on 25th March 2023 in Multi-Purpose Hall, Ground floor. An informative video in Hindi was also shared with the MTS staff to raise awareness among them. The committee keeps taking such initiatives to create a safe and comfortable environment to work in.

It is suggested that starting in the next year, each Committee will host four workshops, including two for students (one in each term), one for staff, and one for parents.

## NATIONAL DEWORMING CAMPAIGN

As per direction of the Child Health Division, MoHFW, Govt. of India, it was planned to implement the 1st phase of school based Biannual National Mass Deworming program in Delhi from 1st April to 9th April, 2022. In our school, students from classes II to XII, were administered a single dose of chewable Tablet-" Albendazole 400 mg" on 7th & 8th April 2022, in the presence of their teachers only.



## FACULTY FITNESS PROGRAMME



To be physically fit is one important thing that we all aim for during this time. The Sports Department of the school took an initiative to restart the fitness program for school staff in March, 2023. The morning hours were utilized for the same. All the staff members took part in the program with

full zeal and enthusiasm. The staff underwent various yoga sessions, warm-ups, stretching exercises and aerobics etc. under the leadership of sports coaches. They also used the school gym to keep themselves fit. Staff members felt energetic and refreshed ready to take up their daily routine work.

## **EXEMPLARY BOARD RESULTS**

Excellence in education and fostering the love of learning is the hallmark of our school. We acknowledge the success achieved by the sheer hard work and perseverance of our students, under the expert guidance of their respective mentors. We feel elated to share that the students of class X and XII who appeared for Secondary and Senior School Examination held by CBSE for session 2021-22, passed with flying colours. The highest percentages in different streams were: Science-96.8%, Commerce-96% & Humanities-97.6%. 82% students secured distinctions in aggregate and there were 6 perfect scores in different subjects. As regards class X results, the school average was 82.15% with the highest percentage reaching up to 99.2% (Ms. Arunima Pratap). 10 students got perfect scores in different subjects and out of 114, 85 students got distinctions in aggregate.

Apart from preparing the children for academic demands, the emphasis is on preparing our children to face the challenges of the competitive world. It is a matter of great significance to us that our alumni be well disciplined and carry forward the values they have inherited and excel in life, being role models in the society. A majority of students qualified for JEE Advanced, NEET and other qualifying entrance exams for professional courses and have sought admission in various prestigious institutions/ universities in India and abroad.


### KRUU PROJECT

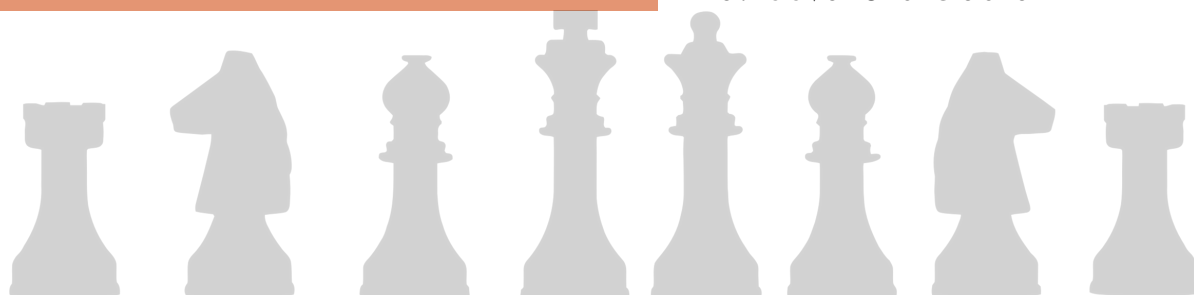

# School Achievements: Awards and Recognitions

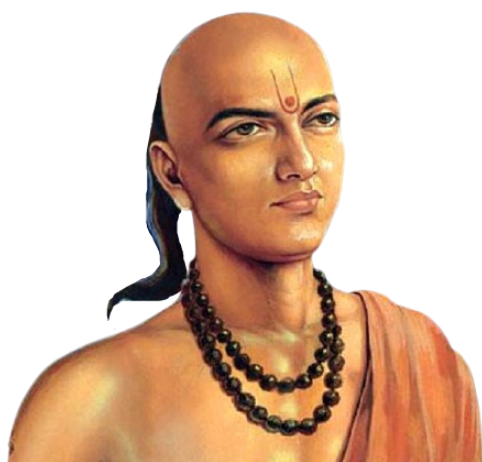
## OECD SURVEY
